

Innovative and enhanced new facilities

Since opening in March 1997, here at Hothfield Manor Acquired Brain Injury Centre, we have been providing a range of accommodation for 24 people with complex neurological disabilities.

Our clients are able to 'step down' from the safety and security of the continually supervised environment at the Manor House, to the more independent environment offered by self-contained individual bungalows, all of which are housed within our picturesque 12 acre site. The main emphasis of the Centre is to assist adults to re-establish lost skills and to re-integrate them back into the community. By providing this 'step down' facility from a safe environment to an independent living environment, carers and community services can be reliably informed about the degree of support required to achieve successful re-integration for individual clients.

In October 2007 Hothfield Manor became part of The Huntercombe Group, one of the leading specialised care providers in the independent sector. As part of a larger organisation, the Centre now has access to a range of support services including the expertise of Professor Mike Barnes, Consultant in Neurodisability and Rehabilitation, who is internationally recognised for his work in this field.

Furthermore, as part of the Group's commitment to continuous improvement, an extensive refurbishment and development programme commenced here at Hothfield Manor in July 2008.

Our new facilities

The first phase of this programme entailed the redecoration and replacement of fixtures and fittings throughout the Centre and this work has now been completed. Our clients now have the benefit of modern facilities, such as widescreen televisions, DVD and music systems, fully equipped bathrooms with the latest specialist bath and hoist systems and a state-of-the-art kitchen.

The second phase of work will create a new extension that will provide a rehabilitation service which will be separately registered, in addition to the existing residential service provided in the Manor. This is due for completion in spring 2010 and the new facilities will include:

- Hydrotherapy and therapy unit
- 19 rehabilitation beds
- Two self-contained flats with guest facilities.
